# Overview for Students Testing in China (including Hong Kong), Korea and Taiwan

With the launch of the GRE<sup>®</sup> revised General Test, students testing in China (including Hong Kong), Korea and Taiwan will benefit from more frequent computer-based testing, which will replace the current split-test administration.\* Here you'll find out what you need to know about the test and important dates that can help in your planning.

## GRE revised General Test: Same-Day Testing, on Computer

- Take all 3 sections of the test on computer, all on the same day
- There will now be one to two fixed administrations per month
- The computer-based test option allows faster score reporting for you, once the regular 10 – 15 day computer-based-test score reporting schedule resumes in December 2011
- The test fees in these regions will be aligned with the international fee structure, eliminating the current split-test administration price tier

- Several important dates for the GRE revised General Test include:
  - Registration opens on March 15, 2011
  - The first fixed-test administration in these regions will be August 6, 2011
  - **Save 50% on your test fee** when you test between August 1 – September 30, 2011
  - If you test during our discount period of August – September 2011, scores will be sent by mid-November
  - If you take the test in October – November 2011, check the detailed score reporting schedule at [www.ets.org/gre/scoreschedule](http://www.ets.org/gre/scoreschedule) to know when your scores will be sent
  - Starting in December 2011, GRE score reporting returns to the regular period of 10 – 15 days after the test date

\* In the current split-test administration, the Analytical Writing section is offered on a computer and the Verbal Reasoning and Quantitative Reasoning sections are offered at a paper-based administration site.

## Last Chance to Take the Current Split Test in China (including Hong Kong), Korea and Taiwan

If you register to take the computer-based Analytical Writing Section between September 19, 2010, and May 7, 2011, you will be registered for the paper-based test administration of the Verbal and Quantitative Reasoning sections on June 11, 2011.

**If you need your scores before November 2011, you *must* take the current GRE<sup>®</sup> General Test before August 1, 2011. Seats WILL fill up quickly, so students must register early to get the date and location of their choice.**
